Tunapuna for the period January 1st, 2017 to April 30th, 2017.

Visitors to constituency office

A number of persons throughout the country continue to visit the Office of the M.P. for Tunapuna on a daily basis seeking assistance on matters that affect their daily lives. The total number of visitors for this period was: Six hundred and sixty-three (663) with most of the visitors, (163) seeking assistance with regards to HDC housing.

Public utilities

The Water and Sewerage Authority (WASA) in conjunction with the Office of the Member of Parliament for Tunapuna, has committed to embark on a number of projects throughout the constituency of Tunapuna in a joint effort to improve and increase the supply of pipe borne water to residents of the constituency. Water pipeline leaks continue to be speedily repaired when reported to WASA officials. The Digicel Foundation, in conjunction with the Office of the M.P. for Tunapuna, WASA, the Councilor for the Area, Mr. Aaron Thomas and the TPRC, has embarked on a water supplying project in the Caura Valley. This is the first, we envisage of many more successful partnerships between the Digicel Foundation and the Office of the M.P. for Tunapuna. The project is expected to be completed and commissioned during the month of June, 2017.

Electricity supply: Service requests made to the Trinidad and Tobago Electricity Commission (T&TEC) are promptly and accurately responded to. Special mention and thanks must be given to the T&TEC Crew for their timely responses to calls for repairs and installations.

A tour of the constituency was conducted by the Minister of Works and Transport, Honourable Senator Rohan Sinanan with the intention of identifying and prioritizing projects in need of attention. Repair works continue to be effectively carried out by the relevant authorities (Ministry of Works/ PURE, TPPRC). Reports and requests are received and dispatched from the Office of the M.P. with urgency to ensure prompt and accurate responses.

Areas visited Re: Future Projects

- 1. Acono Village, Maracas: Box Drain and Pavement in vicinity of Presbyterian School area.
- 2. **Riverside Road Curepe:** Reconstruction of drainage and roadway to minimize erosion in area.

- 3. **Mohammed Street, St. Augustine:** Reconstruction of new roadway and retaining walls and drainage (already started).
- 4. Hill Crest Drive, St. John Road, St. Augustine: Massive retaining wall to prevent erosion to properties.
- 5. Eastern Main Road, Tunapuna, (between Market and Auzonville Road). Repair works on the PBR and Eastern Main Road

Reconstruction of box drain and pavement on southern side of Eastern Main Road.

6. **Caura Road, El Dorado, Tunapuna:** Bridge and roadway construction over the Caura Tacarigua River to minimize heavy traffic between Five Rivers and Tunapuna.

Education

Women in Action for the Needy and Destitute (WAND), working alongside the M.P. for Tunapuna, Mr. Esmond Forde and Head of the Village Council, Ms. Monica Fergusson, successfully launched a training programme in Adult Computer Literacy at the Upper El Dorado Community Centre. A total of twenty trainees who completed the course received their certificate of participation. On hand to witness the presentation was Cultural Icon, Roy Cape who pledged to initiate a music programme under the 'Roy Cape Foundation', in conjunction with UTT, alongside the ongoing computer classes for the community. Members of the adult community, interested in becoming computer literate, are urged to enroll and take advantage of this opportunity. Classes will restart in June 2017

Sports continue to play an essential part in the development of our youths. Here, proud youths show off their trophies received for excellence in their category.




The Member of Parliament continues his drive to have all sporting grounds in the area properly maintained and lit to ensure there are adequate facilities for use by the constituents.


